





Sigmund Freud



Karl Marx



class struggle, which is the idea that society is divided into different classes that are in conflict with each other.




Hannah Arendt


Franz Kafka

Marcel Proust




Isaac Bashevis Singer


Saul Bellow


Elie Wiesel



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
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
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
